## **Forget About Tomorrow**

As playwright Jill Daum first began working on her new play, Forget About Tomorrow, she and her husband, Spirit of the West singer John Mann, had yet to go public with his diagnosis of early onset Alzheimer's.

When director Jean Wyenberg heard about the play from friends who'd seen its premiere at the Belfry in Victoria, she knew she wanted to bring it to Gabriola. She made contact with Daum and the Belfry. They were reluctant to give permission to a small community theatre group to stage a full production of the new play. When she asked about staged readings, both the writer and the theatre gave their blessing and what a blessing that was for Gabriola audiences.

As the play opens, the central character Jane (played flawlessly by Donna Deacon) thinks her toughest challenge is coping with her increasingly forgetful husband Tom (Garry Davey) and her recently emptied nest. She soon learns there is a far greater challenge ahead. Following Tom's diagnosis of Alzheimer's, Jill takes comfort and distraction from wherever it is offered. But her love for Tom draws her back to him, to face whatever may come together.

There was a surprise ending after the performances were over. Donna and Garry astonished and delighted the cast and other invited friends by getting married at the wrap party.



The couple, who've been together for eleven years, have appeared on stage together twice this year. Apparently it was the sight of Donna in her *Psychopathia Sexualis* wedding dress that prompted Garry's proposal. (That's not actually true, but it makes a good story.)

What is true is that, having decided to tie the knot, they decided there was no one they wanted to share their day with than their Gabriola Players family. (How either of them got through the matinee performance just before their wedding is anyone's guess!)

The auditions will be held at the Rollo Centre on **Sunday January 6** from 2pm to 4pm.

Gabriola Players is pleased to announce that our friend Garry Davey will be offering a workshop, **Acting 101: Basic Scene Work and Rehearsal Technique** at the Rollo Centre on Tuesday and Thursday, **January 8 and 10** from 7pm to 9:30 pm in January.

"Over the course of two evenings, we'll go over some key elements of exploring and rehearsing a short scene," explains Garry. "We'll review basic stagecraft and talk about such things as situation vs. character, goals vs. obstacles, and actions vs. attitude. The focus will be working with a partner while exploring basic scene-building and rehearsal techniques that will help develop confidence and comfort on stage. We will work through each scene on the Tuesday, then participants will be able to work at home, reviewing and rehearsing independently. During the Thursday evening session we will rework each scene, and address whatever questions arise."

**Sign up early!!** Maximum of eight participants, although auditors are welcome. To register, send an email to gabriolaplayers@gmail.com with the subject line Acting 101. The workshop will be held at the Rollo Centre. Participants should bring a pencil, pen and notebook, wear comfortable clothing and arrive early so the workshop can start on time. Participation is free for members of Gabriola Players, \$25 for non-members.




#### **One-Act Plays**

Don Whitton was a member of Gabriola Players from its inception. He was involved in numerous productions before he passed away in 2010. In his memory, Gabriola Players offers an annual bursary of \$500 to a Gabriolan who is registering or has registered to study some aspect of **Theatre Arts** at a British Columbia university, college or recognized training centre.

The focus of study can be acting, directing, stage management or any related technical skill, such as lighting, sound or set design. Applicants must be a minimum of ten years old. There is no upper age limit. The Bursary may or may not be awarded in any given year, depending on whether or not there are applicants who meet the qualifying criteria.
