#### Live theatre next month!

Theatres may be closed around the globe, but that isn't going to stop us performing. To paraphrase *The Hitchhikers Guide to the Galaxy*, **Don't Pan(dem)ic!** 

If rumour is to be believed (and let's say it is), William Shakespeare put his time to good use when London – and all its theatres – went into lock down in 1606 due to an outbreak of the plague. It is rumoured that during this period he wrote *King Lear* and possibly (depending on which rumour you believe) *Macbeth* and *Antony and Cleopatra* to boot.



At least two Gabriolans – **Ray Appel** and **Tom Radcliffe** – have also been inspired to write plays in lock down. (Click <u>here</u> to find out what they have to say for themselves – and their plays.)

On September 17, 18 and 19 and 7pm we will be performing these plays live on Zoom. Tickets (or perhaps more accurately "the right to view in the comfort of your own home") are \$10 and can soon be purchased on our <u>website</u>.

In Tom's short play, *All and Nothing*, Alan and Emma, a couple who moved from Toronto to the gulf islands last year (and are weathering the pandemic with sailing and walks in the woods), catch up with friends from the city. Daisy, a healthcare worker, is currently in quarantine in a hotel, whilst Chris has watched his plans to open a massage therapy practice go up in socially distanced smoke.

In Ray's one-act play, *Syd's Cosmic Slump*, comedian Syd has been offered a great opportunity – the chance to perform a stand-up routine as part of a nationally televised variety show. Problem is, Syd can't think of anything funny to say, what with a pandemic raging and his father Max isolated in his care home. Chilled Uncle Larry advises going with the flow, but the flow's dried up.

These are all available on YouTube, including filmed performances of a number of our original one-act plays.



- Living in Paradise, also by Lesley Hazeldine, performed on Gabriola and Galiano Islands in 2018.



### As we were saying...


... before we were so rudely interrupted.
