

I was delighted to work with two tremendous fellow actors Joelle Baird and Chloe Sauer, who brought such playful enthusiasm and authentic emotions to their various characters.

So much terrific feedback including a friend who remarked on how 'the range from humour to irascibility to poignancy' of Grandad Ken came through. Another even remarked they'd like to see it again if they could. What more could one want to hear!"

Gabriola Players is once again inviting applications for the Don Whitton Memorial Bursary from island residents who are pursuing post-secondary education in some aspect of theatre arts. The field of study does not have to focus on acting, directing or playwriting, but could be set design, lighting, sound, costumes – anything theatre-related.

Don was a member of Gabriola Players from the beginning. He appeared in numerous productions before he passed away in 2010, and was the guiding spirit behind our improvisation workshops. The bursary, established the year after his death, is our way of honouring this fine man.

Despite reduced pandemic revenues – and thanks to the generosity of the Whitton family and others – we are again able to offer a \$1000 bursary. (If there is more than one successful applicant, the bursary will be divided equally.)

The Realistic Joneses




