What's coming in 2024? Check page 6 to find out.


Many thanks to all our members for your continuing support with either an annual membership or as one of our new Sustaining Members. These fees are an enormous help with non-production overhead costs.



# Halfway There

In a diner in a small Nova Scotia town (the claim to fame of which is its location exactly halfway between the Equator and the North Pole), old pals Vi, Rita and Mary Ellen meet in the afternoons to share the day's gossip with their friend Janine. Into this well-established mix enters Sean, a handsome doctor from Toronto, just arrived in town as a locum. Things are about to start changing.

Like all Norm Foster plays, relationships are at the core of *Halfway There*: the friendship shared by the four women and now the budding relationship between Janine and Sean.



As one reviewer described it, *Halfway There* is "just a lovely play, old-fashioned and truthful, warm and wise, funny and touching, and never in a contrived or tiresome lesson-teaching way". And the emphasis really should be on *funny*.

Directed by **Kerry Woodrow**, the play features **Donna Deacon**, **Miranda Holmes**, **Christine McKim**, **Scott Rivers** and **Helen Shilladay**.

We are delighted to be performing once again at the newly refurbished **Gabriola Theatre Centre**, established by Antony Holland. Those of us who knew Antony know that, in addition to being an excellent actor, director and teacher, he was the best audience member any actor could want – always in the front row and, with comedies, always roaring the loudest with laughter. Antony would have loved *Halfway There* – one of the funniest plays you will ever see!

## Panto Sundays

Although there will not be a Gabriola Players panto staged live at the Community Hall this year, we didn't want kids of all ages left out of our season. So, we've booked the **Gabriola Theatre Centre** for the first three Sunday afternoons in December for screenings of pantos past.

#### Sunday, December 3



In 2014 we staged the world premiere of *Will Shakespeare The Panto* by Robin Bailes. Alex Dewar and Aleksandra Brzozowski starred as Will and Rosie, ably supported by Paul O'Sullivan, John Gooding, Nadine Mourao as members of Will's troupe and Lesley Hazeldine as the dame. This was Joe DiCara's first appearance as a panto villain (a role he was born to play). With Jenn Feenan majestically playing Queen Elizabeth and a wonderful supporting cast, including Cec Ashley, Trish Gray, Sam Hooton, Ginny Lowes, Trish Gray, Herb Metcalfe and Nick Squire. "Pythonesque perfection" as one audience member described it.

#### Sunday, December 10



Our fourth Robin Bailes panto, *Ali Baba* was staged in 2019 with Ray Appel as the hapless hero and Adrienne Muscat as the heroine. Joe was back as the villain, along with his bumbling bunch of thieves (BJ Godson, Paul O'Sullivan, Tom Radcliffe and Jean Wyenberg), Wendy Phillips was the dame and Donna Deacon her lovelorn swain. Another great supporting cast included Steve Compton, Ed Deeks, Steve Elder, Hilary Farmer, Jenn Feenan, Jasmine Ginn, Dave Hallam, Mitch Levine, Jeff Malmgren, Marshall Mangan and Lawrence Spero. One lifelong theatre goer described the scene pictured here as the funniest thing he'd ever seen on stage.

#### Sunday, December 17



A chance to enjoy again what has been hailed as "the best panto ever" – our 2022 production of the fifth and final Bailes panto, *Cinderella*. Newcomers Katie MacLean and Benjamin Sams wowed as Cinderella and her Prince. A female villain this time (Helen Shilladay) with two nasty daughters (John Gooding and Neil Shilladay). Buttons (Donna Deacon) lost Cinderella but found love with Evie (Christine McKim). Love was also in the air for the baron (Tom Radcliffe) and the fairy godmother (Wendy Phillips). With Kerry Woodrow as Dandini, BJ Godson as Paige, Marshall Mangan as the "dancing king" and the ladies in blue: Bronwyn Cameron, Hilary Farmer, Jenn Feenan and Dianne Holm.

All three screenings will begin at 2pm. Entrance fee is \$5.



Another play was produced when we were finally able to get back to live on stage performances with our 2022 One-Act Play Festival. And yet another play that came out of the workshop was performed this past spring at the 2023 Festival. Not bad, eh?



We decided to get the band back together – with some new members. Meetings began in September and will continue until mid-November, by which time we hope we will have a number of submissions for possible performance at next year's festival. Looking forward to seeing what emerges.

## Membership
